DALLAS, TEX., FEB. 4 (AP)-THE EIGHT TUMORS DISCOVERED IN JACK RUBY'S BRAIN COULD NOT HAVE BEEN THERE 3 1/2 YEARS AGO WHEN HE SHOT LEE HARVEY OSWALD, DOCTORS SAY.

A FINAL AUTOPSY REPORT RELEASED YESTERDAY CONTAINED THE SURPRISE INFORMATION ABOUT THE BRAIN TUMORS -- THE LARGEST THREE-FOURTHS OF AN INCH-BUT DOCTORS WHO TREATED RUBY EMPHASIZED THE TUMORS WERE FAIRLY NEW.

THEY WERE AN OUTGROWTH OF THE CELL-LINING TYPE OF CANCER WHICH RIDDLED RULY'S LUNGS AND WHICH LED TO HIS DEATH JAN. 3 IN PARKLAND HOSPITAL, SAID EARL ROSE, DALLAS COUNTY MEDICAL EXAMINER. A MASSIVE BLOOD CLOT WHICH SPED FROM RUBY'S LEG TO HIS LUNGS DEALT THE DEATH BLOW.

ROSE SUMMONED REPORTERS AFTER BEING REPEATEDLY ASKED IF THE BRAIN TUMORS COULD HAVE BEEN PRESENT WHEN RUBY GUNNED DOWN OSWALD TWO DAYS AFTER OSWALD WAS CHARGED WITH KILLING PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY NOV. 22, 1953, IN DALLAS.

RUBY'S DEFENSE IN HIS 1954 TRIAL CENTERED AROUND WHAT HIS ATTORNEY, MELVIN BELLI, CALLED A BRAIN DISORDER WHICH CAUSED SYMPTOMS OF PSYCHOMOTOR EPILEPSY.

ROSE SAID HE AND OTHER SPECIALISTS FOUND NO EVIDENCE OF 'EPILEPSY OR ABNORMALITIES IN THE BRAIN.

"THE QUESTION IS 'WAS THIS TUMOR IN THE BRAIN IN 1953?' I CAN'T GIVE YOU AN ANSWER," ROSE SAID.

"BUT RUBY'S X-RAYS IN 1934 (IN THE COUNTY JAIL) DID NOT SHOW A TUMOR OF THE LUNG AND THUS IT COULD NOT HAVE SPREAD INTO THE BRAIN," HE ADDED.

HE SAID THERE WAS NO QUESTION BUT WHAT THE EIGHT TUMORS WERE "PART AND PARCEL OF THE CANCER IN RUBY'S LUNGS. AND HE COULDN'T HAVE HAD THAT TYPE OF LESION IN HIS BRAIN FOR AS LONG AS THREE YEARS."

THE AUTOPSY ALSO SHOWED THE SAME VARIETY OF CANCER HAD PENETRATED RUBY'S LYMPH NODES, LIVER, PANCREAS, RIGHT PLEURA, RIBS AND VERTEBRA, IN ADDITION TO HIS LUNGS AND BRAIN.

RUBY WAS AWAITING A SECOND TRIAL WHEN HE WAS STRICKEN IN JAIL WITH WHAT FIRST WAS TREATED AS A COLD. HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO PARKLAND DEC.
