NEW YORK, FEB. 20 (AP)-TIME MAGAZINE PRINTED A SERIES OF PHOTOGRAPHS TODAY AND SAID THEY PROVE THAT AT LEAST FIVE KENNEDY AIDES WERE PRESENT DURING THE 1963 SWEARING IN OF PRESIDENT JOHNSON.

WILLIAM MANCHESTER, IN THE LOOK MAGAZINE SERIALIZATION OF HIS BOOK, "THE DEATH OF A PRESIDENT," SAID PHOTOGRAPHS OF JOHNSON'S OATH-TAKING CEREMONY THE DAY OF THE ASSASSINATION "DID NOT RECORD THE PRESENCE OF A SINGLE MALE KENNEDY AIDE."

A PREVIOUSLY PUBLISHED PICTURE HAS SHOWN KENNETH P. O'DONNELL STANDING NEXT TO MRS. JOHN F. KENNEDY DURING THE CEREMONY ABOARD AN AIR FORCE PLANE IN DALLAS.

IN REPLY, MANCHESTER HAS SAID HE RELIED ON THE RECOLLECTIONS OF A MAJORITY OF THE 33 PERSONS ABOARD THE PLANE.

TIME, IN ITS FEB. 24 EDITION ON NEWSSTANDS TODAY, PRINTS A PANEL OF 19 PICTURES--SEVEN OF THEM SHOWING JOHNSON TAKING THE OATH OF OFFICE.

TIME IDENTIFIES AS PRESENT IN THE PHOTOGRAPHS KENNEDY AIDES O'DONNELL, DAVID POWERS, MAC KILDUFF AND DR. GEORGE BURKLEY. IT ADDS THAT THE FIFTH AIDE WAS THE MAN WHO TOOK THE PICTURES, ARMY CAPT. CECIL STOUGHTON, KENNEDY'S OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHER.
