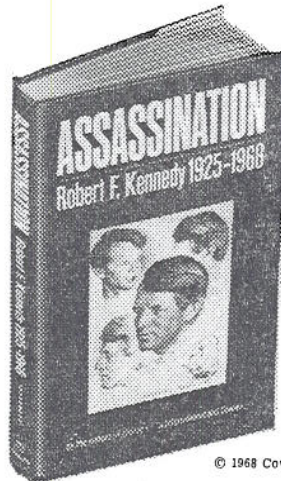


It began on a note of hope and triumph—the call of “on to Chicago and let’s win there.” Minutes later, the cheers of victory became screams of horror—the future had become the past.
