



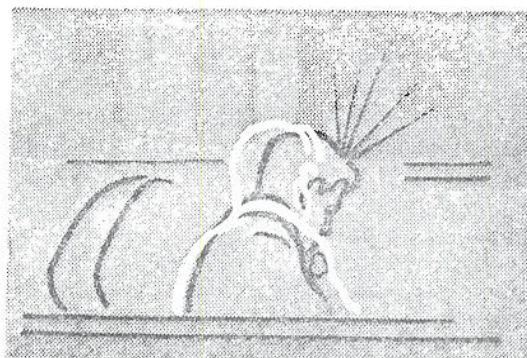

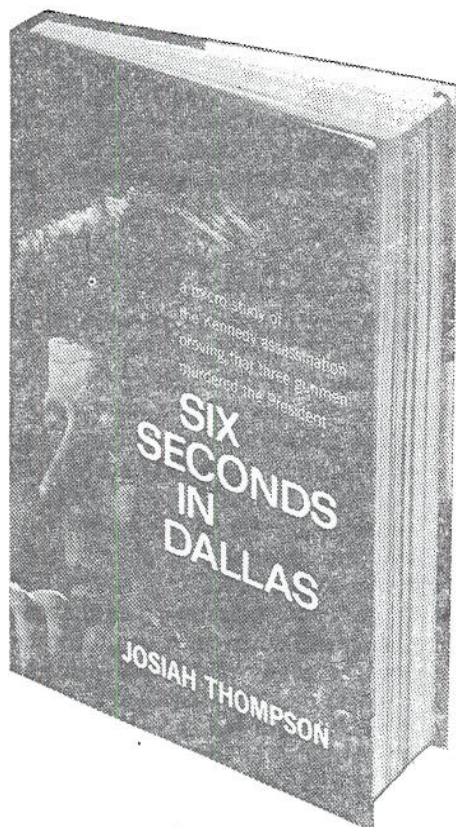

Professor Josiah Thompson, who was a member of the *Life* Magazine team investigating the assassination, has looked at those shattering six seconds in Dallas as they have never been looked at before. He lays bare a whole level of contradictory evidence buried beneath the conclusions of the Warren Commission — evidence that was either ignored, disregarded or misinterpreted. He makes an irrefutable case against the "single-bullet theory" upon which the Commission based its major conclusions.



Professor Thompson spent three years micro-analyzing all of the motion-picture films and photographs connected with the assassination (many published in this book for the first time). He compared the results with ballistic evidence, medical reports and testimony from eyewitnesses, including many who were passed over by the Commission.

Professor Thompson's documented conclusion: "Three assassins fired four shots from three different locations. The first and third shots were fired from the depository — most likely from the sixth floor, southeast corner window later identified by the Warren Commission as the sniper's nest. The second shot, wounding the Governor, was fired from the east side of Dealey Plaza — most likely from a building rooftop. The fourth and final shot was fired from a point near the corner of the stockade fence."
