PRECEDE WASHINGTON, OSWALD-THREAT 1963

DALLAS, TEX., NOV. 25 (AP)-AN ARMORED CAR WAS OBTAINED TO MOVE LEE HARVEY OSWALD FROM THE POLICE STATION TO COUNTY JAIL BECAUSE OF AN ANONYMOUS THREAT ON HIS LIFE, CAPT. GLENN KING SAID TODAY.

THE ANONYMOUS MESSAGE--"OSWALD WILL NEVER GET TO THE COUNTY JAIL ALIVE"--WAS RELAYED BY THE FBI IN WASHINGTON, D.C., TO DALLAS LAW OFFICERS EARLY YESTERDAY MORNING.

"THAT'S WHY WE BROUGHT IN THE ARMORED CAR," SAID KING.

OSWALD, 24, ACCUSED ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, WAS SHOT FATALLY IN THE BASEMENT OF THE POLICE STATION AS HE WAS BEING TRANSFERRED TO THE COUNTY JAIL. JACK RUBY, 32, DALLAS NIGHT CLUB OWNER, WAS CHARGED WITH MURDER IN OSWALD'S DEATH.

KING SAID THAT DALLAS LAW OFFICERS ALSO RECEIVED ANONYMOUS TELEPHONE THREATS ON OSWALD'S LIFE FROM NEW YORK AND CALIFORNIA AND SEVERAL TELEGRAMS FROM ALL OVER THE NATION THREATENING HIS LIFE.

THE FBI DID NOT SAY IF THE CALL THEY RECEIVED WAS FROM A MAN OR A WOMAN.
