TOKYO, JULY 27 (AP)-FORMER PRESIDENTIAL PRESS SECRETARY PIERRE SALINGER TOLD THE FOREIGN CORRESPONDENTS' CLUB OF JAPAN TODAY THAT PRESIDENT KENNEDY DID NOT WANT TO GO LAST NOVEMBER TO DALLAS, WHERE HE WAS KILLED.

SALINGER, WHO DID NOT ACCOMPANY THE PRESIDENT ON THE TRIP, SAID THE LAST TIME HE SPOKE TO KENNEDY, THE PRESIDENT SAID HE WISHED HE WAS NOT GOING TO DALLAS BECAUSE HE WAS WEARY. SALINGER SAID THE PRESIDENT MENTIONED NOTHING ABOUT ANY PREMONITION.

SALINGER, THE DEMOCRATIC NOMINEE FOR THE U.S. SENATE IN CALIFORNIA, PREDICTED THE COMING U.S. PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN WILL BE "VERY TOUGH AND MEAN." HE SAID CIVIL RIGHTS WILL BE AN ISSUE. SALINGER IS ON A WORLD TOUR.
