

New Clue To Oswald's Mexico Trip

A further piece in Lee Harvey Oswald's trip to Mexico, some seven weeks before the assassination of President Kennedy, has fallen into place with the discovery of a Mexican bus ticket stub.

Marina Oswald, the widow of the accused assassin, found the stub while going through some of her husband's belongings last week.

Sources close to Mrs. Oswald said the stub was from a one-way ticket from Mexico City to Laredo, Tex.

It was turned over to the FBI immediately, the sources said, for transmittal to the Warren Commission, which is investigating the assassination.

Investigative agencies have interviewed hundreds of witnesses since the November 22 assassination in an attempt to accurately trace Oswald's steps to Mexico.

It is known that he was seen in a Dallas bus station September 25, and that he crossed the border at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, September 26. He returned to Dallas on October 4.

The bus ticket stub indicates that the ticket was purchased in Mexico City October 1 or October 2.
