DALLAS, SEPT. 9 (AP)-A PICKET JAILED AFTER THE NOV. 22 ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY FILED A FALSE ARREST SUIT AGAINST THREE POLICEMEN YESTERDAY.

THE PICKET, GENE A. GUINN, ASKED \$150 DAMAGES IN THE SUIT AGAINST CAPT. PAT GANNAWAY, HEAD OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S SPECIAL SERVICE BUREAU, AND DETECTIVES T. T. WARDLAW AND M. H. BRUMLEY.

GUINN WAS ONE OF SIX PERSONS ARRESTED NEAR THE TRADE MART SHORTLY AFTER THE ASSASSINATION. POLICE SAID THEY WERE WAVING ANTI-KENNEDY SIGNS AND WERE HELD FOUR DAYS FOR INVESTIGATION. KENNEDY WAS EN ROUTE TO SPEAK AT THE TRADE MART.

GUINN SAID A TRESPASSING CHARGE AGAINST HIM WAS DISMISSED AND HE FILED THE SUIT TO RECOVER "LOST INCOME." HE SAID OFFICERS GAVE HIM ONLY TWO ASPRIN'S FOR HIS ULCER.
