

Ceremony in Dallas Honors Memory of Late President

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Dallas honored the memory of President John F. Kennedy today with the first public service here since the days immediately after Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas three years ago.

Private citizens organized the ceremony, which featured the Fort Worth Boys Choir that sang for Kennedy the morning of his death.

An early visitor to the new historical marker a block from the sloping street where the late President was killed was Dallas

Mayor Erik Jonsson.

He carried a wreath of blush-pink roses on a green satin standard "on behalf of the city."

Jonsson said he recalled how "we were not only shocked but stunned three years ago, like people all over the world.

"Time changes the form of grief but not the emotion itself," the mayor said. "A great many people here think of the President a good deal, now and in between these anniversaries. I know there are really these feelings."
