ELECTION-DAY HOLIDAY?

The Carter Administration is working on an election-reform package to submit to Congress next year, and one of the items being studied is a proposal to declare Election Day a national holiday in Presidential-election years. Proponents believe that more voters would go to the polls if they didn't have to go to work, but detractors argue that another national holiday would reduce business productivity. A Tuesday holiday, they add, might tempt workers to create a four-day weekend by taking Monday off as well—and if they take it away from home, they won't vote.
