Garrison, Playboy Oct 67 p. 166: "We have also located another man - in green combat fatigues - who was not involved in the shooting but created a diversionary action in order to distract people's attention from the snipers. This individual screamed, fell to the ground and simulated an epileptic fit, drawing people away from the vicinity of the knoll just before the President's motorcade reached the ambush point."

Aubrey Rike, ambulance driver, Tape No. 5 at about 116 feet, says he was waiting at Parkland for his patient, the epileptic, to be registered when Presidential party arrived.

Parkland admission record, XXI 156, showing entries from 12:31 to 3:42 p.m., does not show Belknap's name. Not admitted to hospital?
