

WALTHER, Mrs. Eric (Carolyn)
(see Jean Hill)

Was standing 50 or 60 feet south of the south curb of Elm St., then went up to curb. She saw a man wearing a brown suit and very dark red (? illegible) shirt leaning out of a window on the third floor, "somewhere about the middle window of the third floor." Later looked back at TSBD and saw a man in either the fourth or fifth floor, southeast corner window; was positive this window was not as high as the sixth floor. She had not noticed him there previously. This man was wearing white shirt and had blond or light brown hair, and was holding a rifle with the barrel pointing downward outside the window. In the same window, to this man's left, she could see a portion of another man. This man was "apparently wearing a brown suit coat"; all she could see of him was his right side, from "about the waist to the shoulders."
