

# Votes in Senate on ABM

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6 (AP)—Following are the roll-call votes by which the Senate defeated two amendments by Senator Margaret Chase Smith to the military authorization bill. The first amendment would have barred spending on the Safeguard missile defense system. The second would have barred the Safeguard system but permitted other anti-missile research.

The roll-call vote on a third proposed amendment, offered by John Sherman Cooper and Philip A. Hart, was identical to the vote on the second Smith amendment except that Mrs. Smith voted against it. It would have barred deployment of Safeguard while permitting research and development to continue.
