

## Report in Kopechne Death Is Given to Boston Court

EDGARTOWN, Mass., Feb. 19 (UPI)—A court clerk from Boston, traveling under state police escort, took custody today of the judge's report and the secret transcript of the testimony on Mary Jo Kopechne's death in Senator Edward M. Kennedy's car last July.

Edward V. Keating, clerk of Suffolk Superior Court, and an assistant took the documents from Mrs. Sophia Campos, clerk of the Dukes County Su-

perior Court. The documents were not made public.

District Judge James A. Boyle, who presided at the four-day closed-door inquest last month, filed his report yesterday.

The documents will remain impounded until it is determined whether a trial will be held. Miss Kopechne died when a car driven by the Senator plunged off a bridge on Chappaquiddick Island.

If a trial is ordered, the documents will be impounded until after the trial. If there is no trial, the documents may be made public.
