Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.) is to leave today on a tour of Western Europe and the Middle East, meeting with leaders of seven countries.

Kennedy is to be in London Nov. 10-13 to attend the assembly meeting of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

On Nov. 14, he is to lunch in Paris with French President Valery Giscard D'Estaing, leaving that evening for Vienna.

In Austria, Kennedy is to be guest of Chancellor Bruno Kreisky, and on Nov. 15 is scheduled to make a "major address" in Vienna.

16 for meetings with Prime
Minister Yitzhak Rabin and
Foreign Minister Yigal Allon,
and is to dedicate a health
care center of the Ben Gurion
University at Beersheba.

Kennedy is to drive over the border from Israel to Jordan Nov, 17 and meet with King Hussein in Amman the following day, then flying to Cairo, where he is to meet with Egy-pitain President Anwar Sadat.

On Nov. 19, Kennedy is to fly to Lisbon to meet with Portuguese President Francisco Da Costa Gomes. He is to deliver a speech in Lisbon before returning to Washington Nov. 20 ton Nov. 20.
