"I think there's a campaign on to give it to the Kennedys—I think the guy they're after is Ted," said **Kenneth P. O'Donnell**, appointments secretary to the late President Kennedy, disputing yesterday the reports of intimate relations between the President and **Judith Campbell Exner**. Mr. O'Donnell, now a business consultant in Boston, said that many women had made similar claims about President Kennedy, but that "there is not much in his life, after 1957, that I didn't know about." Every appointment was put on the record, and "there were no secret passages," he said.

"Ted" was a reference to **Senator Edward M. Kennedy**, Democrat of Massachusetts.

Mr. O'Donnell discounted Mrs. Exner's Congressional testimony of 20 White House luncheons and 70 phone conversations with President Kennedy. "Even **Jacqueline Kennedy** didn't have lunch 20 times with the President in the White House," he said.
