

**EXTENSION OF GUARD  
FOR KENNEDYS URGED**

WASHINGTON, March 20—The House Appropriations Committee recommended Monday that Secret Service protection be continued for Mrs. John F. Kennedy and her two children.

The Secret Service has provided around-the-clock protection for Mrs. Kennedy and her children since the assassination of President Kennedy on Nov. 22, 1963.

A spokesman for the Secret Service declined today to disclose how many agents are assigned to the Kennedys. "We never discuss anything like that," he said.

Congress first voted Secret Service protection for Mrs. Kennedy and her children, Caroline and John Jr., for two years following the assassination. This was later extended for another two-year period, which expires next November.
