

# All-Night Party Honors Jackie

ATHENS — (AP) — Aristotele Onassis threw a big birthday party for his bride of nine months at an Athens seashore night club last night. It lasted until well after sunrise today.

"It was her baptism into Athenian night life," said one of the guests. "She was really thrilled and looked very happy."

Mrs. Onassis, who was 40 Monday, came to Athens from her husband's private island yesterday morning for her first big shopping trip here since she came to Greece for her marriage to 62 year old Onassis Oct. 20. Onassis flew from Skorpis in the Ionian Sea and joined her later.

### Minidress

The party began at Onassis' villa in Glyfada with a dinner and shifted to the Neraida (Sea Fairy) night club on the Saronic Gulf.

Mrs. Onassis wore a pastel print minidress with sandals and gold earrings shaped like miniature spaceships flying to the moon, a birthday

present from an Athens jeweler.

She clapped to the rhythm of Syrtaki dance music, played on a bouzouki.

"It's a very complicated dance," she said later, "but its simply marvelous."

Onassis, who sat close to her, kept explaining the words of the songs from Greek to her.

### No Breakage

"I want to know every word of these beautiful songs," she was heard telling him.

Unlike previous visits to bouzouki clubs, Onassis did not break any plates. The custom has been banned under a government law as "barbaric."

With the couple were Onassis' 18 year old daughter Christina, his two sisters, with their husbands, and a number of close friends.

The couple returned to Skorpis at noon, where Mrs. Onassis' children, John and Caroline, are holidaying with their cousin Kathleen Kennedy, eldest daughter of the late Sen. Robert F. Kennedy.
