Would-Be Seller of Letters By Mrs. Onassis Fined \$100

Theodore Donson, a 31-year-old lawyer who tried to sell let-ters written by Mrs. Aristotle Onassis to former Deputy De-fense Secretary Roswell Gil-patric pleaded guilty to a mis-demeanor charge yesterday in Criminal Court and was fined \$100. \$100.

Mr. Donson who had been charged with violation of the Administrative Code, which makes it a misdemeanor to have property worth more than \$10 in one's possession without authorization of the owner.

Mr. Donson, who said he got the letters by mail from a man who later could not be traced, offered them to Charles Hamilton, the autograph dealer, last February. Mr. Gilpatric said they had been taken from a locked file in his law office.

Mr. Donson, who once worked for the Gilpatric law firm, was employed in the financial district at the time of the letter incident, He is now listed as unemployed.
