
Bobby Says He Won't Run for President in '68

New York

Senator Robert F. Kennedy told the New York Post yesterday he is "not under any circumstances going to run for President or Vice President" in 1968, and urged a group pushing his candidacy to discontinue its efforts.

"I appreciate their support, but I am going to support President Johnson and Vice President Humphrey," the Post quoted the Democratic Senator as saying.

Kennedy's office confirmed the quotes.

The group, "Citizens for Kennedy and Fulbright in 1968," is headed by Dr. Martin Shepard, a New York Psychoanalyst, and claims to have more than 2200 members throughout the country.
