

RFK's Son Opposes Probe

Robert F. Kennedy Jr., the 21-year-old son of the late Senator Robert F. Kennedy, said yesterday that he opposes reopening the investigation into his father's assassination.

The young Kennedy, visiting New York to promote a television special he stars in, was asked at a news conference his opinion of the theory that a second gun was used in the June, 1968, fatal shooting of his father in the pantry of the Hotel Ambassador in Los Angeles.

"I don't think there's anything to it," young Kennedy said. "I think all it takes is one crazy guy. Let it go - leave it."

Asked about efforts under way in Los Angeles to have the investigation reopened, including motions approved recently by the county court to refire the gun taken from convicted killer Sirhan Sirhan, Kennedy reiterated, "they should let it go; just leave it."
