Victory Talk Hit Violence

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — In the victory speech Robert Kennedy delivered moments before a gunman fired a bullet into his brain, the New York senator urged his supportors to help him deal porters to help him deal with the plague of violence in America.

It was in large measure a joking, jubilant speech. But Kennedy was solemn

as he declared:

"I think we can end the divisions within the United States."

"We can work together," he said, to overcome "divisions, violence, disenchantment.

"We can start to work together, we are a great country, a selfless country, a compassionate country....

"What all of these primaries have indicated, and all of the party caucuses have indicated, was that people in the Democratic Party and the United States, want a change

Kennedy said he hoped now to "concentrate on hav-ing a dialog or a debate, I hope, between the vice president and perhaps myself on the directions the country is going to take."
