U.N. Assembly Silent In Tribute to Senator

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., June 7—The 124 nations of the U.N. General Assembly paid a formal tribute to Senator Robert F. Kennedy to-day with a minute of silence after an address by the President, Corneliu Manescu of Rumania.

The session put off the question of South African rule in South-West Africa to Manescu, followed by an expression of thanks by Arthur J. Goldberg, chief representa-J. Goldberg, chief representa-tive of the United States.

Mr. Manescu said that Mr. Kennedy had "devoted his efforts to promoting respect for the ideals of peace, of the struggle against prejudice, discrimination and inequality of understanding quee, discrimination and inequality, of understanding and of international cooperation."

He read to the Assembly a telegram from Mrs. Kennedy, which said that the many expressions of sympathy from the United Nations were a source of great com-fort because her husband "believed deeply that the Charter of the United Na-tions must be made a real-ity for all peoples of the world."
