Few Clues in Attack on Sirhan Kin

PASADENA - (AP) -Lack of evidence is hindering police investigation of a report that Saidallah Bishara Sirhan, brother of the man charged with murdering Sen. Robert Kennedy, was fired at

on a highway.

Police are without clues to locating a white Volkswagen bus from which Sirhan said two shots were fired at him early Wednesday.

Two .38-caliber slugs were recovered from Sirhan's car, but police said a ballistics test would be useless until the gun that fired the shots

can be found.
Sirhan, 35, told police two shots were fired at him from one of two cars that followed him as he drove home on the Pasadena Freeway.

Sirhan was taken to his

mother's home, which is under heavy police guard.

Sirhan is unemployed and had been living in an apartment. He is the second eldest of the five Sirhan brothers. His brother, Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, 24, is awaiting trial in Los Angeles in the Kennedy killing.
