LOS ANGELES AP - The attorney for Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, charged with murdering Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, notified Superior Court Wednesday he will seek another trial postponement.

Russell E. Parsons filed a motion asking to appear before Judge Herbert V. Walker, who will preside over Sirhan's trial, at Walker's convenience to request continuance until after Jan. 2, 1969.

Sirhan, a 24-year-old Jordanian, is set to stand trial Dec. 9. He is accused of shooting Kennedy June 5 moments after the senator proclaimed victory in California's Democratic presidential primary election.

Parsons gave no specific reason for asking the continuance. But he has said he will seek medical examinations for Sirhan and says another attorney who is involved in another trial will join him in the case.

Judge Walker announced, meanwhile, that all news media that have applied for seats will receive them, either in the courtroom itself or in an auxiliary courtroom where proceedings may be viewed on closed circuit television.

Actual seat assignments will be released by individual letters to the media.

Walker said the court wants to do everything possible to insure an open and public trial and at the same time provide proper decorum and personal protection for the defendant.

He added: "We are fully cognizant of the fact that the eyes of the nation as well as the world will be on this trial. We want the news media to have the best possible facilities to do a fair and accurate job of reporting to the public."
