Mr. Bugliosi, who prosecuted Charles Manson, the convicted mass murderer, and is now in private practice representing parties calling for a complete reopening of the assassination investigation, said that Mr. Di Pierro's statement indicated that as many as 10 bullets had been fired in the pantry. The gun wrested from Sirhan B. Sirhan, who was convicted of Senator Kennedy's murder and is serving a life term, had a cartridge chamber containing only eight bullets.
