Mark Lane, meeting at Sun Reporter, Mar. 19, 1964

Thayer Waldo, of the Fort Worth Star Telegram, was at the Trade Mart and heard the first police bulletin: "The President has been shot. It is feared that others in his party have been shot as well. It appears that all the shots came from the direction of the overpass."

Mrs. ... Hill took pictures of the motorcade [from the side of the street to the left of the President's car]. The pictures were taken from her by the FBI. She has a receipt, but the pictures have not been returned to her. A bullet hit at her feet (or at the feet of her companion, ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ ~~the picture~~ wearing a red coat, shown in the foreground of the picture).

O.V. Campbell, after the shooting, ran toward the overpass. Truly also thought shots came from the overpass.

Oswald, when arrested, had \$13 in his pocket, and \$150 in top drawer of his dresser.

On the day of the President's visit, every single person who had publicly s poken out in favor of school integration was followed.
