Aug. 24, 1966 - Interview of Lane by Joe Dolan, telephone call-in Wednesday program, KEWB, Oakland. Program runs from 10 p.m. to 1 a.m. Dolan devoted entire three hours to interview and did not accept any calls.

(Program taped in entirety, with the exception of news and commercials.)

Aug. 25 Thursday

Dolan, conversation with callers, three hours.
 With the exception of three calls on other subjects, all calls were on assassination and Lane program. Of these, only one caller accepted Commission version of events.

On Wednesday, Dolan had suggested callers order Lane's book from Paul Elder and indicated store had a good supply. On Thursday evening said supply completely exhausted by 11 a.m., but "several thousand" would arrive from Los Angeles by Friday. "Several thousand" presumably for entire Bay area.

Aug. 26 Friday - According to Dolan, Paul Elder sold out again.

Sept. 1 - Redwood Bookstore. Mrs. Roth said could not obtain copies of Rush to Judgment from supplier because completely sold out. (Uncertain whether she meant local situation, or publisher sold out. First edition, 30,000, Aug. 15.)
Second printing scheduled for latter half of September.
