

Jane Fonda Sues Laird On Violation of Rights

SEATTLE, March 16 (AP) —Jane Fonda, the actress, sued Defense Secretary Melvin R. Laird Monday for alleged Government violation of her constitutional rights in a recent war protest and said her peace stand might cost her an Academy Award.

"There are some very powerful people in my profession who take an opposite political stand," she said. "I could lose the Oscar over this."

Miss Fonda has been nominated for the best actress award for her role in the movie "They Shoot Horses, Don't They?"

Miss Fonda and her attorney, Mark Lane of New York, were thrown off two Army posts in the Seattle area March 8 and warned not to return when they tried to talk about the war with servicemen and demonstrating American Indians.
