Jane Fonda Arrested At Another Army Base

Ft. Meade, Md.

Actress Jane Fonda, author Mark Lane and 12 others were taken into custody yesterday and warned they could not continue distributing an ti-war literature to soldiers.

Military ppolicemen served papers on the group, warning them that their activity was illegal and they would be arrested if it was continued.

They were taken into custody in front of the main Post Exchange at this Army post, located between Washington D.C. and Baltimore. Miss Fonda and Lane, author of "Rush to Judgment" which questioned the Warren Commission report on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, had earlier addressed about 1000 students at the University of Mary-

land, about 10 miles to the south in College Park.

Lane had played a tape which he said was recorded by an American GI describing how he had watched a prisoner being tortured.

He told the students he thought "Vice Presidnet Spiro T. Agnew should be indicted for crossing state lines to incite riots."
