

The International Commission for Inquiry on U.S. Crimes in Indochina concluded its session today in Stockholm, Sweden. The Commission issued a report saying that testimony submitted to the Commission demonstrated that American policy in Indochina constitutes "genocide." The report said that the testimony "confirmed that mass bombing is still one of the most serious crimes committed by U.S. forces in Indochina." It also said, "The extensive use of chemical weapons in South Vietnam is contrary to internationally accepted rules and laws." The report added that civilians are "the victims of terrorism, mass killing and deportations."

The chairman of the Commission is Gunnar Myrdal, a Swedish economist. Other members include Mark Lane, an American writer, and John Nielands [spelling?], a professor of biochemistry at the Berkeley campus of the University of California.
