NEW YORK, JAN. 3 (AP)-SALE OF A LONG PLAYING RECORD OF AN INTERVIEW WITH LEE HARVEY OSWALD THREE MONTHS BEFORE THE ASSASSINATION OF JOHN F. KENNEDY WAS ORDERED RESTRAINED TODAY UNTIL STATE SUPREME COURT DETERMINES WHO OWNS THE TAPE FROM WHICH IT WAS MADE.

JUSTICE SAMUEL H. HOFSTADTER CONTINUED A STAY WHICH JUSTICE SAMUEL M. GOLD GRANTED FRIDAY.

THE SUIT WAS BROUGHT BY THE INFORMATION COUNCIL OF THE AMERICAS, * A NON-PROFIT NEW ORLEANS ORGANIZATION, AGAINST AUDIO FIDELITY RECORDS INC., TRUTH RECORDS AND FOUR INDIVIDUALS.

THE COUNCIL SAID IT HAD PURCHASED THE TAPE FOR \$6,500 FROM WILLIAM K. STUCKEY OF EVANSTON, ILL., WHO INTERVIEWED OSWALD AUG. 17, 1963. THE COUNCIL SAID STUCKEY, THEN A REPORTER FOR THE NEW ORLEANS ITEM AND A RADIO NETWORK COMMENTATOR, SPOKE WITH OSWALD FOR 40 MINUTES.

AN ATTORNEY FOR THE DEFENDANTS SAID AUDIO RECORDS OBTAINED A COPIES OF THE TAPE FROM A COLLECTOR NAMED AUBREY MAYHEW, ONE OF THE DEFENDANTS. MAYHEW WAS SAID TO BE AUTHOR OF A BOOK CALLED "WORLD'S TRIBUTE TO JOHN F. KENNEDY IN METALLIC ARTS."

STUCKEY, COURT PAPERS SAID, MADE THE TAPE AVAILABLE TO MAYHEW IN DECEMBER 1963. KWIAT SAID THE TAPE WAS GIVEN TO THE WARREN COMMISSION AND THAT IT WAS MADE PART OF THE COMMISSION'S REPORT SOME 93 DAYS AFTER THE ASSASSINATION.
