Lee Hanna, news director of the station, said the "MacBird" segment would be rescheduled on WCBS-TV's "Evening Report" one night this week or on next Sunday's "Eye on New York Journal." It was withheld last night, he added, because of visual flaws in a portion of the film where Leonard Harris, arts editor of WCBS-TV, had been interviewing actors in the play. This had to be refilmed, Mr. Hanna said.

"MacBird" is scheduled to open Feb. 8 at the Village Gate, at 185 Thompson Street. Other characters in the political satire include Robert and Teddy O'Dunc, the Earl of Warren, the Wayne of Morse and Lord MacNamara.
