Robert Larsen, the producer of the projected film, said background footage was shot Saturday in Dallas and during the past few days at his studio in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Among the directors of the corporation that is producing the film are Henry M. Wade, the District Attorney at the time of the assassination who still holds that office, and Jesse Curry, who was the Dallas Police Chief in November, 1963. Marvin Thomas, Mr. Wade's law partner, is president of the corporation, known as Flag-Star Inc.

The corporation was formed last March but its existence, according to Mr. Larsen, was kept secret until Wednesday when word of its establishment leaked to the press.

Mr. Larsen said the picture, which he said would be released in about 10 months, would "recreate in dramatic form" the events of Nov. 22, 1963, and during the subsequent months.

Despite Mr. Larsen's prediction that the picture would be released within a year, Mr. Wade said he was "not optimistic about its ever being made."
