**FILM ON J. F. KENNEDY
WILL BE SET IN WEST**

MADRID, Aug. 28 — A film depicting the assassination of President Kennedy in an Old West setting will go into production next month in Italy and

on the outskirts of Madrid. "It was a crime of Western times," said Maria Cuadra, the Spanish actress who will portray Mrs. John F. Kennedy. "A crime that has no place today." There will be little attempt to fictionalize the basic plot. As reported in the afternoon newspaper Pueblo, a Senator named Kennedy is elected

President and is assassinated while riding along Dallas's main street in a horse-drawn carriage. In this Western version of the assassination, there will be no Lee Harvey Oswald. The killer will probably be someone searching for gold. The Dallas sequences will be filmed near Madrid and the rest

of the picture will be made in Italy. It is a Spanish-Italian co-production to be directed by Tonino Baldi.
