He failed to appear for Friday night's scheduled first preview of "Mort Sahl," a political satire review which he wrote and in which he was to star with four other performers.

Michael Brandman, producer and principal backer of the show, said yesterday he would seek damages and costs from Sahl, who started his career at San Francisco's Hungri i. He estimated the loss, including \$6000 in advance sales, at \$20,000.

Sahl, 40, was believed to have returned to his Beverly Hills home.
