IS BEING REPRESENTED BY A NORTH CAROLINA LAW FIRM.
THE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN ASKED BY MRS. SMITH, A GRANDDAUGHTER
OF ALFONSO DONN, DOORKEEPER AT THE EXECUTIVE MANSION DURING LINCOLN'S
ADMINISTRATION, IF IT WISHES BY BUY THE CLOTHING FOR \$50,000.
MRS. SMITH HAS SUGGESTED, THE NEWSPAPER CONTINUED, THAT THE
CLOTHING BE PURCHASED FOR DISPLAY IN THE NEW LINCOLN MUSEUM BENEATH
WASHINGTON'S RESTORED FORD THEATER, THE SITE OF THE ASSASSINATION.
THE INTERIOR DEPARTMENT IS APPARENTLY NOT GOOL TO THE IDEA,
BUT ITS PROBLEM IS IN FINDING A PATRON OR GETTING AN APPROPRIATION.
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
