Seven Men and Arms Cache

Seized in Oklahoma City

OKLAHOMA CITY, Sept. 20
(UPI)—Federal and state agents arrested seven men and confiscated Nazi decals and about 100 weapons, including machine guns, in simultaneous raids today that capped a threemonth undercover investigation.

An employe at nearby Tinker Air Force Base, a security patrolman for the Oklahoma City public school system and an employe of the United States Soil Conservation Service were among the seven charged with violating the Federal Firearms Act.

Deputy Sheriff Bob Hammer said he and three other undercover officers had purchased "a large quantity" of weapons from the suspects during the three-month investigation.

Sheriff Bob Turner said some of the suspects were reported to be affiliated with the paramilitary Minutemen organization.

Sheriff Turner said the 100 weapons included knives, pistols, shotguns and automatic weapons, with thousands of rounds of ammunition. There also was a briefcase of Nazi decals, and a life raft and three diverses and purchased "a large quantity" of weapons from the suspects were reported to be affiliated with the paramilitary Minutemen organization.
