Rabbi Meir Kahane, director
of the Jewish Defense League,

Rabbi Kahane was arrested that night in a demonstration outside the Iraqi mission to the United Nations, on 79th Street near Fifth Avenue, after he allegedly kicked over a police barrier and encouraged others to follow him through.

He was also charged with riot, but Judge Edward Pincus dismissed that charge on the ground of insufficient evidence. The verdict on the remaining two charges was returned by a jury of four men and two men.
