

**Bomb Explodes in Theater
Showing Film About Castro**

A pipe bomb left in the lobby of a Greenwich Village movie house exploded early yesterday after the theater had closed for the night. The explosion caused only slight damage and no one was injured, the police reported.

A policeman of the bomb section said the bomb, equipped with a timing device, damaged the doors and the showcases of the Fifth Avenue Cinema, at 66 Fifth Avenue, near 13th Street.

A spokesman for United Press International said an anonymous caller told the news agency about five minutes after the explosion that his group, Free Cuban Government, was responsible for the bombing.

The theater recently has been showing a film reported to be pro-Castro called "Fidel," together with President Nixon's "Checkers speech."
