CUBANS INTERRUPT AIRLIFT TO MIAMI

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9—
Cuba interrupted the twicedaily airlift of Cuban refugees
from Varadero to Miami today
on the ground of administrative
delays in the joint processing of
names.

Officials were hoping that
the airlift would be resumed
Wednesday. Approximately 160
refugees are flown out daily,
and there are still several thousand names on the waiting lists
agreed to jointly by the United
States and Cuba, it was reported.

The United States was notified of the interruption by the
Swiss Embassy in Havana,
which handles United States
interests there.

Officials declined to comment
on reports that Cuba may be
seeking to terminate the program, which has brought 240,000 voluntary refugees from
Cuba for resettlement in the
United States since December,
1965. The airlift, which uses
chartered Electra planes, costs
the United States Government
\$1-million a year.
