

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., July 16 (UPI)—The founder of the anti-Communist Min-uteman organization, Robert Bolivar DePugh, 47 years old, and his top aide, Walter Patrick Peyson, 27, were or-dered today to be transferred to Kansas City, Mo. Under the order by United States Commissioner Robert McCoy, DePugh was to be-gin serving a one-year sen-tence or a Federal firearms conviction in Missouri. Peyson's return was based on a bench warrant for his ar-rest for failure to appear for trial in Kansas City in a similar case. The two were arrested last week by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents on

charges of conspiring to rob banks in Washington State to finance the purchase of arms to maintain what their organization called "the last line of defense against Com-munism." United States Attorney Vic-tor Ortega said the Govern-ment chosetoreturn DePugh and Peyson to Missouri be-cause their transfer could be made without a removal hear-ing. He said the Washington Federal district would be able to process their return to that state in the future. The United States Mar-shal's office-said the two men would be taken to Missouri as soon as a formal removal order was obtained from the Federal District Court here.
