Another McIntire March

Washington

Dr. Carl McIntire, fundamentalist minister and anti-Communist spokesman, will try again today to convince President Nixon the United States government is wrong about China and Vietnam.

McIntire and his followers plan their fourth march for victory in recent years and

their third such protest since last fall in a continuing effort the Collingswood, N.J., radio preacher says will go on as long as communism is a threat.

McIntire told a news conference yesterday, his followers will pour into Washington by the thousands today.

However, there was little

indication that the gathering will be as large as the 10,000 to 15,000 that participated in a McIntire march here last spring.

"It is unthinkable that a President who took the oath of office with his hands on the Bible" would make a trip to Communist China, McIntire said. "We'll have the wrath of God upon us if we continue."

McIntire said the marchers will be protesting the President's upcoming trip, and what he called the U.S. no-win policy in Vietnam. In addition, he said, they will march in support of proposed constitutional amendments which would permit prayer and Bible reading in public schools and outlaw busing of school children on the basis of race, color, creed or national origin. *Associated Press*
