Eastland and Nixon Officials Linked to Hunt Testimony

DALLAS, Aug. 6 (UPI)—Two former Attorneys General in the Nixon Administration, a United States Senator and other political figures testified before a Federal grand jury that indicted two sons of H. L. Hunt, the late oil billionaire, last month, a newspaper said today.

The Dallas Morning News, quoting its own sources, said former Attorneys General John N. Mitchell and Richard G. Kleindienst, Senator James O. Eastland, Democrat of Mississippi, Will Wison, former Attorney General of Texas, slipped into Dallas last May and June to appear before the grand jury. The News said a source in the Justice Department indicated that Federal prosecutors may impanel a second grand jury to seek more indictments based on the testimony of the four men.
