Mrs. Nhu Criticizes U.S. On War in South Vietnam

On War in South Vietnam

PARIS, July 8 (UPI)—Mrs.
Ngo Dinh Nhu charged Wednesday that the United States had neglected the Communist Vietcong enemy to turn against the regime of her brother-in-law, the late President Ngo Dinh Diem of South Vietnam.

The widow of President Diem's brother was refused a visa by the State Department to speak at the Flushing, Queens, Conservative Club's "truth rally" held last night. She addressed the rally by means of a tape recording.

In a letter to the club made public today she charged that the United States suspended aid from May through November, 1963, while Buddhists protested against the Diem regime.

A coup toppled the regime and President Diem and his brother Ngo Dinh Nhu lost their lives.
