SAN FRANCISCO, ~~JUNE 20~~ (AP)-THE SECRET SERVICE SAID ~~HERE~~ TODAY ~~T~~ A SEARCH IS ^{BEING MADE} ~~CONDUCTING~~ FOR A 36-YEAR-OLD MAN WHO ALLEGEDLY MAILED PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON THREATENING LETTERS.

A NATIONWIDE, ALL-POINTS BULLETIN WAS ISSUED FOR WALTER DAVIS HENDRICKSON, BELIEVED ARMED AND LAST SEEN DRIVING FROM AN OGDEN, UTAH MOTEL, ~~JUNE 20~~ POLICE ^{had} WERE TOLD.

THE SEARCH WAS FIRST DISCLOSED SHORTLY BEFORE THE PRESIDENT ~~WAS TO~~ ADDRESS THE 20TH ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATION ^{Friday} OF THE UNITED NATIONS' FOUNDING.

SECURITY MEASURES WERE SO TIGHT THAT PICKETS PROTESTING THE PRESIDENT'S VIET NAM POLICIES GRUMBLED THAT THEY HADN'T EVEN GLIMPSED THE PRESIDENT BECAUSE POLICE KEPT THEM AT A DISTANCE.

THE HEAVILY GUARDED PRESIDENT ALSO SKIPPED A PLANNED MEETING WITH U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL U THANT AT THE MARK HOPKINS HOTEL AND CONFERRED WITH HIM INSTEAD AT THE OPERA HOUSE, WHERE HE SPOKE.

THIS CAME AFTER AN EARLIER DEMONSTRATION--CONFOUNDING CHANGE OF PLANS WHEN THE PRESIDENT DECIDED TO ADDRESS THE U.N. ~~ON~~ FRIDAY INSTEAD OF TODAY.

SAN FRANCISCO POLICE SAID THEY WERE TOLD HENDRICKSON WAS ARMED WITH A RIFLE AND AMMUNITION. HIS TRAIL WAS REPORTED LOST AFTER HE LEFT THE MOTEL THURSDAY MIDNIGHT, POLICE SAID.
