AMARILLO, TEX., JULY 31 (AP)-EX-CONVICT WALTER DANIEL HENDRICKSON, 36, DREW THREE YEARS IN PRISON YESTERDAY FOR THREATENING THE LIFE OF PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON AND TWO YEARS FOR STEALING A CAR.

THE SENTENCES, IMPOSED IN FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT, RUN CONSECUTIVELY. HE PLEADED GUILTY.

HENDRICKSON, A NEW YORK NATIVE, WAS PAROLED IN 1956 FROM SING SING PRISON.

EVIDENCE WAS PRESENTED THAT HENDRICKSON MAILED A THREATENING LETTER FROM ALBUQUERQUE, N.M., AND IT WAS RECEIVED AT THE WHITE HOUSE ON APRIL 15. THE CAR WAS STOLEN IN NEW YORK.

HIS LETTER TO THE PRESIDENT SAID: "THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT YOUR TURN WILL COME. I WILL DO A BETTER JOB THAN OSWALD AND WILL SUCCEED IN ESCAPING."
