DALLAS, TEX., DEC. 9 (AP)-EDWARD SAMEL, 44, CHARGED WITH THREATENING THE LIFE OF PRESIDENT LYNDON B. JOHNSON, WILL UNDERGO PSYCHIATRIC EXAMINATIONS, A FEDERAL COURT HAS RULED.

SAMEL, ARRESTED IN NEARBY ARLINGTON, TEX., MONDAY, WILL BE TAKEN TO THE FEDERAL MEDICAL CENTER AT SPRINGFIELD, MO., FOR A PERIOD NOT TO EXCEED 60 DAYS.

ASST. U.S. DIST. ATTY. TIM TIMMINS JR. ASKED FOR THE SANITY INVESTIGATION FOR SAMEL.

TIMMINS SAID THE MAN'S MOTHER TOLD THE SECRET SERVICE THAT HE COULD NOT HOLD A JOB AND HAS BEEN TRAVELING ABOUT THE COUNTRY FOR ABOUT FIVE YEARS.

THE ALLEGED THREATS AGAINST THE PRESIDENT WERE MADE IN TAMPA, FLA., LAST MARCH.

WHEN ARRESTED, OFFICERS SAID SAMEL HAD THREE RIFLES, TWO SHOTGUNS, A PISTOL AND AMMUNITION. "I KNOW YOU," HE WAS QUOTED AS TELLING THE OFFICERS, "PRESIDENT JOHNSON HAS SENT YOU TO KILL ME."
