
**Texan Gets 2-Year Term
For Threatening Johnson**

TOPEKA, Kan., March 11 (AP) — United States District Judge George Templar today sentenced a Fort Worth, Tex., youth to two years in prison for threatening the life of President Johnson.

The youth, Ray Dan Pierce, 18 years old, will be eligible for probation after serving two months.

Pierce was arrested on a charge of writing a threatening letter Sept. 21 while in jail at Holton, Kan., where he was held for being absent without leave from the Navy.

Kent State University freshman from Miles, Ohio, was under Government probation today for making a threat on the life of the President. Secret Service agents disputed Virtue's insistence that he was only joking when he made his threat.
