

**New Rochelle Cabby Held
In Threats to the President**

NEW ROCHELLE, N. Y., Aug. 28—A 40-year-old taxi driver has been arrested here and charged with making telephone calls threatening the life of President Johnson.

The man, William Fuller of 36 Echo Avenue, was picked up Saturday by the New Rochelle police, booked under the United States Code, and then turned over to the Secret Service. He was held today in \$1,000 bail set by United States Commissioner Earle Bishopp.

According to the New Rochelle police, Mr. Fuller made, since July 17, 10 to 15 calls from different telephone booths in New Rochelle to the White Plains office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

He threatened, the police said, to kill the President, using a rifle fitted with a telescopic sight.
